Family Preservation

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Family Preservation program is a strengths-based program that both promotes the safety and well-being of children and their families. It also strives to maintain permanency in the home for children identified through the Department of Children & Family Services and/or the Juvenile Probation Department. The program actively seeks to obtain or directly provide the critical services needed to enable the family to remain together in a safe and stable environment.

PROGRAM GOAL

The primary goal is to enhance the parents'/caregivers' ability to create a safe, stable, and nurturing home environment that promotes healthy child development. With this program, the entire family is the client.

SERVICE AREA

The SFVCMHC, Inc.'s Family Preservation Program services the following areas: Burbank, Glendale, La Canada/Flintridge, La Crescenta, Montrose, North Hollywood, Pacoima, Panorama City, Sherman Oaks, Studio City, Sun Valley, Universal City, Valley Village, and Van Nuys. The program can also service

other cities within the San Fernando Valley area on a case-by-case basis.

REFERRAL PROCEDURES

Referrals come from the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) after a child abuse report has been filed - whether a court case is initiated or not - as long as it is believed that the family would benefit from additional supportive services. In addition, probation officers from the Juvenile Probation Department also make direct referrals to the Family Preservation Program. Both social workers and deputy probation officers are active and important participants in the overall service planning for each family, and attend the Multi-Disciplinary Case Planning Committee (MCPC) meetings to review the needs of the family and discuss service provision progress.

SERVICES

Services may include, but are not limited to:

- Weekly in-home case management visits
- Short-term individual therapy
- Parenting classes

- Substitute Adult Role Modeling (SARM)
- Teaching and Demonstration of basic skills (T&D)
- Therapeutic Day Treatment (TDT) – Probation only
- Auxiliary funding to help the family maintain financial stability
- Referrals for food and clothing programs, housing programs, substance abuse and domestic violence programs, long-term individual/couple/family therapy services, transportation services, and tutoring services.

HOURS OF OPERATION

Monday - Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Weekday in-home appointments are scheduled based on family's need.

COST

Services are provided at no cost to the family through funding from the Department of Child and Family Services.
